

Northwest Eye Surgeons Covid-19 Vaccine FAQ

Q. How can I schedule an appointment to get the vaccine?

- A.** All vaccine appointments should be made online by visiting www.nweyes.com/vaccine-scheduling. Please do not call Northwest Eye Surgeons or our Sight Partners affiliates for vaccine appointments or updates. We need to keep our phone lines open. Any vaccine calls will be redirected to our online registration website.

You must make two appointments, approximately 4 weeks apart. Enter your preferred date/time when scheduling first and second vaccine appointments.

Enter your contact information, name, email address, phone number. You will receive a confirmation through email or text with your first and second appointment date, time and clinic directions. You will receive a downloadable patient health intake form to fill out and bring with you to each scheduled appointment. Any changes to your existing appointment need to be handled online. Only individual appointments can be scheduled. We can't schedule a group appointment.

Q. Which type of vaccine will be administered?

- A.** Moderna

The Moderna vaccine is recommended for people aged 18 years and older. You may be asked to show proof of age 18 years or older.

Q. Where is the physical appointment location?

- A.** We are administering the vaccine at our Seattle and Mount Vernon surgery centers. Visit nweyes.com for clinic location with directions and parking information. Free Parking available on Sat.

Q. When are the available times the vaccine will be administered?

- A.** Appointments will be held from 8:00 am - 4:30 pm



Q. Is there a cost for the vaccine?

- A.** The vaccine is at no cost to the patient. Costs for administering the vaccine are covered by insurance, and will be billed. If a person is eligible for the vaccine and doesn't have insurance, they can still receive the vaccine at no cost.

Q. How can I best prepare for my appointment?

- A.**
- ✓ We require you to wear a mask at all times.
 - ✓ Bring a photo ID and insurance card (if available)
 - ✓ You will need to fill out a personal health intake form for each vaccine appointment.
 - ✓ You can download and complete this required form before each 1st and 2nd appointment or print it out to bring with you [LINK TO PATIENT HEALTH INTAKE PDF FORM](#)
 - ✓ We'll take your temperature and ask about your health
 - ✓ A healthcare provider will review your intake form and explain the steps of the vaccine
 - ✓ A healthcare provider will give the vaccine via a shot in the upper arm
 - ✓ After getting the vaccine, you'll wait 15 minutes in a socially distanced area, and receive a
 - ✓ vaccination record card.
 - ✓ Adhere to all social distances protocols to reduce potential exposure of patients and employees to COVID-19 throughout your appointment.
