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Vision Correction: Post-operative Care Follow-up Schedule

Post-operative management of patients who choose cataract surgery with additional Vision Correction is similar, in that most patients are seen at Northwest Eye Surgeons on the first post-operative day. Patients who choose to have their post-op care co-managed will be transferred to the co-managing doctor when the eye is stable post-operatively (typically after the one day visit).

With Vision Correction, a premium intraocular lens may be used during the procedure, and each IOL has specific requirements for optimal outcomes. For patients who have chosen additional Vision Correction through cataract surgery, recommended post-operative visits and guidelines for specific IOLs are outlined below.
